




Top 5 Completed Medical Referrals

Pediatric Insights

In 2025, Access Health served 357 pediatric patients, including 293 children ages 0-8, reflecting our strong focus on early childhood health and development.

Research shows that one in four children experiences or witnesses' trauma. These experiences, known as Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), can affect brain development, immune function, and emotional regulation. Over time, ACEs may contribute to challenges in social, emotional, and academic success, as well as increase the risk of long-term health concerns.

To help reduce these risks and support healthy development, Access Health incorporates ReadyRosie, a research-based parenting curriculum designed for families with children ages 0-6. Through short, practical videos and guided insights, ReadyRosie empowers parents to strengthen early literacy, build positive routines, and create nurturing home environments that promote lifelong health and learning. By investing early, we are helping families build strong foundations for brighter, healthier futures.

Our Role in the HUB Pathway Model

As a Community Health Worker (CHW) program, we support clients by documenting and delivering services through the Hub Pathways Model. In Stark County, this model is led by the Stark County Community Action Agency Hub, with our program serving as a designated Care Coordination Agency (CCA). The Hub Pathways Model offers a structured, coordinated approach that connects individuals to the services they need through defined "pathways."

CHWs work closely with clients to identify needs, set personal goals, and follow through with care. This approach enhances outcomes by tracking progress, reducing service duplication, and promoting whole-person, community-centered care.
